Abstract Submission Guidelines

The scientific committee invites submission of Scientific and Best Practice Abstracts.

- 1. All abstracts must be structured according to the provided format.
- 2. Abstracts should not exceed **350 words**.
- 3. Abstracts should not include images, tables, charts or graphs
- 4. All abstracts should be accompanied by **ethical approval** or **ethical waiver**.
- 5. Accepted abstracts will be presented either as **oral** or **poster** presentation.
- 6. Abstracts should be submitted via the online **abstract management system**. Click here to submit an abstract.

Format for Abstracts:

- ✓ **Title**: The abstract title should be descriptive, informative, and concise and scientific names should be italicized and not be preceded or followed by quotes, commas, parentheses or other markings.
 - **Example 1**: Unravelling the Role of *Saccharomyces cerevisiae* in Ethanol Fermentation Efficiency
 - **Example 2**: Understanding the Dynamics of *Vibrio cholerae* Transmission in Urban Water Systems

Abstract Structure

- 1. Scientific Abstracts:
- ✓ **Introduction:** An opening sentence or two that introduces the study, includes the problem statement and rationale for the study. Indicate the purpose of the study or the hypothesis that was tested.
- ✓ **Methods:** Include the study design, setting, the subjects, and the type of analysis.

- ✓ **Results:** Present the results of the study. (Please state clearly, if you do not have results available, but indicate any preliminary and anticipated results)
- ✓ **Conclusions:** Briefly discuss the data and emphasize the significance of the results.

2. Best Practice Abstracts:

- ✓ **Introduction:** An opening sentence or two that introduces the study or project. Include the problem statement and rationale for intervention.
- ✓ **Methods:** Describe the intervention/change(s) to practice and process of implementation in sufficient detail.
- ✓ **Results:** Present the results of that indicate changes between initial state of practice and changes implemented.
- ✓ **Conclusion:** Describe the meaning of your findings and specific practice implications. What went well/what didn't work?

Evaluation

All abstracts will undergo a rigorous review process conducted by the 2024 Research Conference Scientific Committee and other co-opted experts. Abstracts will be reviewed by a minimum of three reviewers.
